Objectives – At the conclusion of the activity participants will be able to:

Sugar and Safe Care

- 1. Discuss issues of patient safety in the delivery of care to sick newborns.
- 2. Identify infants at increased risk for becoming hypoglycemic and hyperglycemic.
- 3. Describe the signs and symptoms of hypoglycemia.

Temperature

- 1. Identify infants at increased risk for becoming hypothermic.
- 2. Discuss the physiologic responses to hypothermia for premature and term infants.
- 3. Describe the necessary precautions to observe when re-warming severely hypothermic infants.

Airway

- 1. Describe the basic evaluation of neonatal respiratory distress.
- 2. Identify supportive interventions for infants in respiratory distress.
- 3. Discuss how to evaluate a blood gas.
- 4. Discuss the signs and symptoms of a pneumothorax.
- 5. Identify the steps in emergency evacuation of a pneumothorax.
- 6. Describe pain assessment of the newborn.

Blood Pressure

- 1. Describe three causes of shock in the Neonate.
- 2. Identify components of assessment related to recognition and evaluation of shock in the infant.
- 3. Identify factors related to safe administration of Dopamine.

Lab Work

- 1. Identify risk factors that predispose infants to infection.
- 2. Describe the clinical signs of neonatal sepsis.
- 3. Discuss laboratory tests indicated for evaluation of infection.
- 4. Summarize basic white blood cell development and calculation and interpretation of the absolute neutrophil count and immature total: ratio.

Emotional Support

1. Discuss the crisis that families face when the infant requires care in a neonatal intensive care unit.

2. Discuss ways neonatal ICU caregivers can facilitate parenting in the NICU and how to support parents of sick and/or premature infants.

3. Describe cultural and gender differences in coping and the grief experience.

4. Summarize concerns regarding patient safety and methods to reduce medical errors and preventable adverse events in this vulnerable population.

1. Discuss the importance of self-assessment to evaluate care provided.
